Since 2016, Prairie Grit has hosted 250+ participants, 550+ volunteers, 40+ adaptive sports and recreational opportunities.

Participants and their families joined us from all across the state and even from across some borders! They've come from Jamestown, Grand Forks, Bismarck, Mandan, Fessenden, Carpio, Stanley, Burlington, Rugby, Granville, Dickinson, Oxbow, Glenburn, Crosby, Williston, Max, Minot AFB, Berthold, Harvey, Minot, Westby, MT and Moorhead, MN.

Participants we've met have a variety of different abilities, including: cerebral palsy, spina bifida, autism, traumatic brain injury, stroke, amputations, spinal cord injuries, William's syndrome, epilepsy, muscular dystrophy, spinal muscular atrophy, Down syndrome, arthrogryposis, cancer, Dandy Walker syndrome, hearing impairment, visual impairment, saethre-chotzens syndrome, developmental delay, juvenile rheumatoid arthritis, Duane syndrome, encephalopathy, microcephaly, Jordan's syndrome.
